First meeting of Mentor/Mentee

Review guidelines of journal together: jpedrehabmed.com/peer-review



Review expectations of timeline together:

- Set a date for two or three 20-minute meetings prior to the due date -- Having dates pre-set will help keep both parties on
- Number of meetings can be dependent on mentor/mentee pair

Mentor: Consider completing online CME for this activity Recommended: Research Academy Certified Peer Reviewer Course

Second meeting

Discuss the paper



Mentor: Can use a journal club format Recommended: Web of Science Peer Review Template Page 1

Third meeting

Critical Review of the paper



Bring a written review to discuss together:

- Consider reviewing the JPRM review guidelines and paper format
- Discuss differences and similarities in your key ideas
- Finalize points to incorporate for the final review to submit

Mentor: For novice reviewers an independent review by you and mentee may be helpful

Final meeting

Submitting the review



Re-read and resolve final issues Mentor should submit with the mentees name and credentials



Acknowledgements



All mentor and mentee reviewers credits are published in *JPRM* yearly Can be used in an academic track for education and peer review experience
